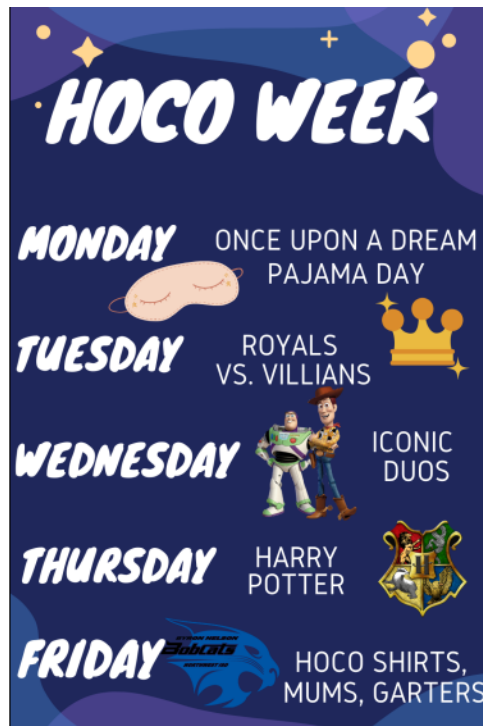

REQUEST A VERIFICATION OF ENROLLMENT FOR YOUR DRIVER'S LICENSE

Students, if you need a Verification of Enrollment (VOE) for the Department of Public Safety to get your permit or driver's license, please stop by to request it from your assistant principal's secretary. AP offices are located in AC119, AC221, & AC324. VOE forms are valid for 30 days.

STUDENTS, IF YOU DRIVE TO SCHOOL YOU NEED A PARKING PERMIT

If you drive on campus, please stop by the Counseling Office to purchase your parking permit. Students are allowed to park in spots with a number only. Please do not park in Staff, Handicap, Visitor, or Senior Parking (unless you have purchased that particular Senior spot). Senior with a reserved spot, if someone should park in your Reserved Senior Spot, please take down the BNHS permit number & license plate, park in visitor, and see Mrs. Wilbur in the counseling office. She can help you get this resolved.
